(O/Z) Readers of Oz



The book selection for January is "The Wordy Shipmates" by Sarah Vowell.

In this *New York Times* bestseller, the author brings the Puritan era wickedly to life" (*Washington Post*). To this day, America views itself as a Puritan nation, but Sarah Vowell investigates what that means-and what it should mean. What she discovers is something far different from what their uptight reputation might suggest-a highly literate, deeply principled, and surprisingly feisty people, whose story is filled with pamphlet feuds, witty courtroom dramas, and bloody vengeance.

The Washing Post review: On first blush Vowell seems like an angry atheist set down at the historian's table. But under this anger is a good measure of empathy. Hers is not the narrative of an angry adolescent who never wants to return to her Pentecostal parents' home. It is the narrative of an adult who wants to see her American home for what it is—and for what it has done to her, and to us...what makes *The Wordy Shipmates* float is not so much its arguments as its voice. Most writing on the Puritans is as dour as the Puritans themselves. Vowell has fun with them, and in the process, she helps us take seriously both their lives and their legacy.

Presbyterian Church Structure
The overall church structure is made up of 4 governing bodies. These are the:

Session / Council or local governing body--ordained ministers (Teaching Elders) and
Ruling Elders, all elected by the congregation. Session meets monthly.

Presbytery....elders and ministers from congregations who oversee several churches.

Meetings are held every other month.

Synod...representatives elected from each presbytery to oversee several presbyteries. Meetings are held twice yearly.

General Assembly...the national governing body made up of equal numbers of lay people and clergy chosen by the presbyteries. G.A. meets every other year.

The Presbyterian Church of Oronoco is a member of the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area and the Synod of Lakes and Prairies.


