On the first Sunday in November, we remember ... We grieve ... We honor ... We give thanks ...

All Saints' Day is a tradition that's basically as old as the Church itself. Very early on in the life of Christianity, each soul that had been martyred for their faith was remembered, honored, and celebrated on the anniversary of his or her death. But all too soon, there were so many martyrs to remember that it was too hard to give each one the honor that they deserve. So All Saints' Day was established as a special, dedicated time to honor all the saints, known and unknown. For a while, it was celebrated in connection with the Easter season, but it has been celebrated on Nov. 1 since 895 C.E.

According to the Presbyterian Mission Agency, "All Saints' Day has a rather different focus in the Reformed tradition. While we may give thanks for the lives of particular luminaries of ages past, the emphasis is on sanctification of the whole people of God. Rather than putting saints on pedestals as holy people set apart in glory, we give glory to God for the ordinary, holy lives of the believers in this and every age ... We also pray that we may be counted among the company of the faithful in God's eternal realm."

Brothers and sisters, we want you to know about people who have died so that you won't mourn like others who don't have any hope.

Since we believe that Jesus died and rose, so we also believe that God will bring with him those who have died in Jesus.

~ 1 Thessalonians 4:13-14.

This is why we honor All Saints' in the way we do.

We celebrate on the first Sunday of the month – on communion Sunday – so that we can come to the table of grace surrounded by those we love: those living and those who feast at God's eternal table.

We celebrate by quite literally surrounding ourselves with the names of those we have loved and lost, both above our heads and on the walls. You cannot look anywhere in the sanctuary without seeing those names. They are visible. They are prominent. They are forever before our eyes.

We celebrate in color because God knows the people whose names surround us added color to our lives. The color of our banners reflect the laughter and the love, the brightness and the boldness, the jokes and the joy. It's color that remains vibrant and life-giving even after they're gone. And it's color that we can share with others as well, passing on the encouragement and inspiration that we received from our loved ones in ways that honor them still.

So whether you're honoring your loved ones here in worship with us on November 3rd or whether you're observing All Saints' Day at home, I invite you to light a candle. Pray. Pause for a minute and let the memories of the loved ones that you've lost warm your heart and your spirit. Let those memories bring a smile to your face. Let them lift you up. And go forward bolstered by the hope and reassurance that we find in the gospel: that because Jesus rose, we will also rise and join God – and all those who have died in Jesus – in eternal glory. Alleluia. Thanks be to God.
