

The annual OZ Joint Worship Service will be held on Sunday, August 10, the last day of the Goodhue County Fair. This is the fourth year that the service has been held in conjunction with the Fair. Something new has been planned for this year: Instead of a potluck following the service, we will go next door to the Pork Producers booth and dine on pork sandwiches. Those of you who attended last year's service may remember the wonderful aromas coming from that booth, and many commented that we should just eat there. Presto chango! This year, we will!

A free will donation will be collected to cover the cost of the pork sandwiches, with Council and Session making up cost overrun if there is any. We will enjoy food and fellowship, and we won't even have to cook.

Worship will be at 10:00 a.m., and for our music this year, we will be joined once again by Light 45, a band based out of Rochester that play, among other things, great Christian worship music. There is free parking and admission at the fairgrounds for the service if you arrive prior to 10:00 AM. The music and service will be held in the Entertainment Tent at the center of the fairgrounds. Coffee and non-coffee drinks will be available.

This year marks the 48th anniversary of our yoke, an event that celebrates our ecumenical partnership. Please come—and bring your friends. All are welcome.

A Message from Our Pastor



When they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken; and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God with boldness. Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all.

~ Acts 4:31-33.

This idyllic scene appears in the book of Acts after the miraculous and inspiring events of Pentecost, after a few of Peter's sermons, and after Peter and John have both been arrested and subsequently released.

There is power in this passage: "When they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was *shaken*."

There is an intense holy presence: "They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God with boldness."

And there is sacred harmony: "Now the *whole group* of those who believed were of *one heart and soul*."

"Of one heart and soul ..."

Ahhh ... wouldn't that be beautiful? Wouldn't that be amazing? Wouldn't that be perfect?

But alas, this is not always so. In recent months, both the MN Conference of the UCC and the General Assembly of the PC(USA) met to discern aspects of our future as denominations. Each of these gathering spanned hours of discussion about many of the issues that continue to dominate the headlines these days: immigration, peace in the Middle East and other

parts of the world, racial disparity, marriage equality, poverty, and so many others.

I had a wonderful time attending this year's Annual Meeting of the MN Conference in June, and while I wasn't able to be in Detroit to attend General Assembly (GA), I certainly followed along online as much as possible. (Yes, I realize I'm revealing the presbynerd in me.) At both gatherings, there was prayer. There was worship. There were wonderful connections made between brothers and sisters of faith, and there was definitely the presence of the Holy Spirit.

But there was also disagreement. There were differing opinions. There were definitely times when both assemblies were not "of one heart and soul."

As the two different break-out groups at the MN Conference annual meeting discussed the two resolutions before the body – one having to do with encouraging racial diversity within the conference and the other having to do with immigration – both groups experienced times when not everyone in the room saw eye-to-eye over the wording proposed or the actions recommended. And when the resolutions were brought back to the entire body for a vote, there was still more work to be done; more opinions that didn't quite line up, more ideas to explore, more discernment to be undertaken.

At GA, there were 15 committees that dealt with the 70+ overtures made by the various presbyteries across the country. Each committee deliberates for a few days before bringing their recommendations back to the full assembly for still more discussion, discernment, and, finally, a decision. Again, there was disagreement. There was discord. There were plenary sessions that lasted long into the night as people wrestled with Scripture and with their own personal convictions, trying to follow the elusive leadings of the Holy Spirit. Decisions were made. Votes were taken. Some were left celebrating while others were disappointed.

Friends, as human beings, we have been given minds to think, hearts to feel, and free will to muddle through this life and faith of ours together. We all come from different backgrounds. We bring different

perspective and different opinions. We hold up different values and issues as near-and-dear to our hearts. As a church, and as the Church universal, we would love to emulate the early church as it's portrayed in Acts – all together in unity of heart and mind. But this is not our reality. Sometimes we disagree. Sometimes we argue. Sometimes we find ourselves caught in the midst of misunderstandings and misrepresentations.

In times like these, can we still love each other? Yes. Can we still pray together? Yes. Can we still worship one God in honesty and humility and integrity together? Yes. Even when we aren't always "of one heart and soul," we can still come together as brothers and sisters in Christ with important things in common, things like faith and love and grace.
